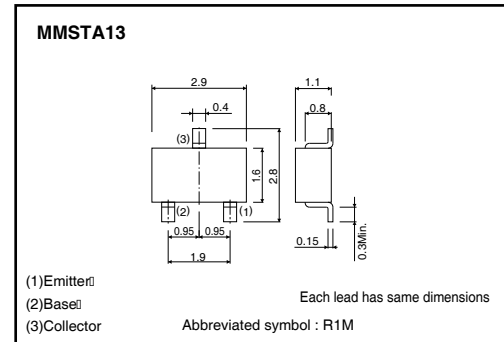

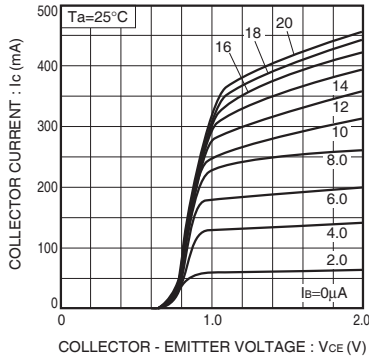


Fig.1 Typical output characteristics (I)

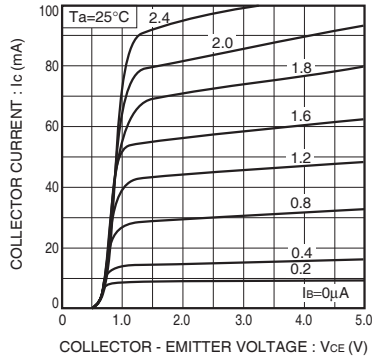


Fig.2 Typical output characteristics (II)

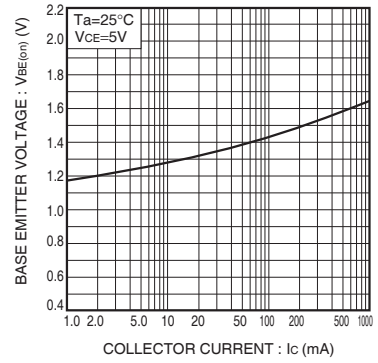


Fig.3 Base emitter 'ON' voltage vs. collector current

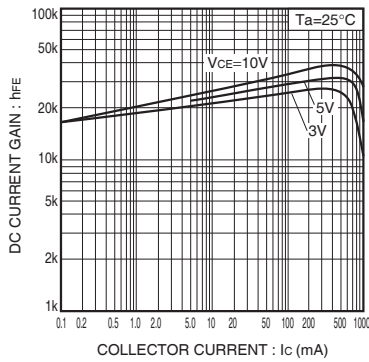


Fig.4 DC current gain vs. collector current (I)

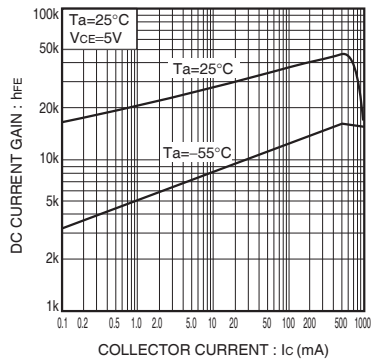


Fig.5 DC current gain vs. collector current (II)

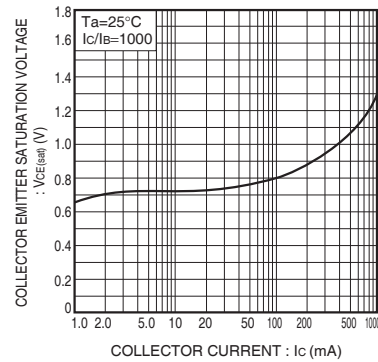


Fig.6 Collector emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current

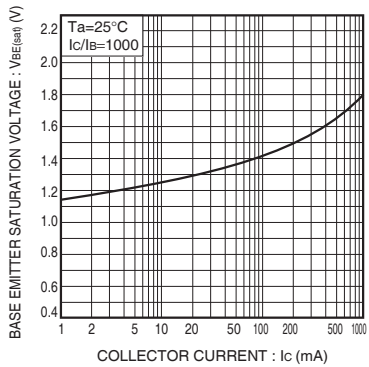


Fig.7 Base emitter saturation voltage vs. collector current

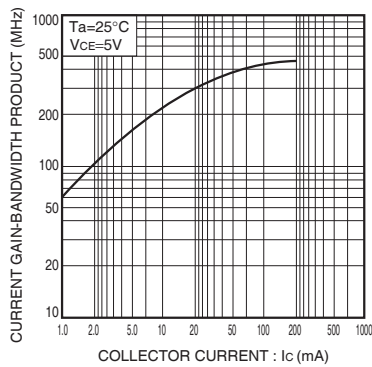


Fig.8 Current gain-bandwidth product vs. collector current

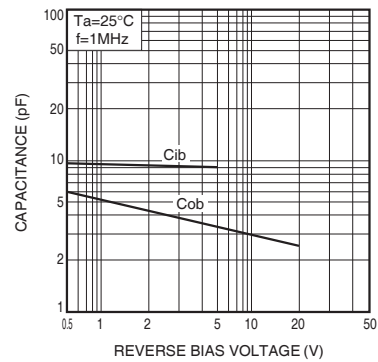


Fig.9 Capacitance vs. reverse bias voltage
